

GRADE 10 COURSE SELECTION





THE COURSE SELECTION "CONTRACT"

- You have a direct impact on which courses are offered each year
- If not enough students choose a course, it will not run!
 - Example: if 15 students choose a course, that is not enough for it to run so the course would be cancelled
 - Example: if 60 students choose a course, two blocks of that course would run
- Be sure to choose THOUGHTFULLY
- See your counsellor if you need help choosing classes
- No elective changes will be possible in September
- No changes to accommodate teacher preferences or to be in the same class with friends



COURSE SELECTION TIMELINE

- February 2nd MyEd Portal is open for you to enter your course requests
- February 28th MyEd Portal closes for course selection
 - After this date, all changes to your course requests must be completed by your counsellor
- April Course Verification begins (your chance to change your course requests)
- April Course Verification ends
 - After this date, you can still change your course requests through a conversation with your counsellor

Two Elective Courses*

May be chosen from the following areas:

- Languages
- Visual & Performing Arts (art, drama, dance, music)
- ADST (business ed, tech ed, home economics)
- Leadership (or First aid 11)

Additional graduation requirements: an ADST or Fine Arts course (one in grade 10, 11, or 12), minimum of 28 elective credits, an Indigenous-focused course, minimum 30 hours of volunteer/work experience, Literacy 10 assessment, Numeracy 10 assessment, Literacy 12 assessment




ENGLISH 10 OPTONS

English 10


The grade 10 English program allows students to choose a topic of study that interests them. All strands will continue to develop and extend their knowledge and skills in reading, writing, speaking, listening, viewing, and representing.

Students have the option of taking English Studies 10 or a variety of English First Peoples 10 options. All English 10 courses are offered in 2 credit parings (for 4 credits total).

Science-based faculties typically need at least Pre-Calculus 12

Non-science faculties often accept Foundations of Math 12

Some trades programs may accept Workplace Math 11



LANGUAGE COURSES

- Many universities require a Grade 11 Language course for admission (e.g., French 11, Spanish 11, Mandarin 11, Japanese 11, etc.)
- Language courses are optional, but you will want to consider your Language needs to keep post-secondary options open
- If you do not take a Language in Grade 10, you can still take an Introductory Language class in Grade 11 and a full Language 11 class in Grade 12 to meet university admission requirements (e.g., Introductory Mandarin 11 + Mandarin 11)

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)

AP Courses offer:

- access to rigorous college-level work
- exploration of subjects at a deeper level of learning
- development of confidence, time management and study skills
- advancement of research and communication skills
- increased creative, problem-solving, and analytical skills
- 4 credits per course towards graduation requirements
- possible credit for first-year university courses


SUMMER SCHOOL

https://burnabyschools.ca/summersession


- Students going into grade 10 are welcome to register for any Grade 10 summer school class

- Note: taking Career Life Education 10 in summer school allows you to take another elective course













