THE COURSE SELECTION "CONTRACT"

- You have a direct impact on which courses are offered each year
- If not enough students choose a course, it will not run!
 - Example: if 15 students choose a course, that is not enough for it to run so the course would be cancelled
 - Example: if 60 students choose a course, two blocks of that course would run
- Be sure to choose THOUGHTFULLY
- No course changes will be accommodated in September
- NOW is the time to look at post-secondary requirements
- See your counsellor if you need help choosing classes



COURSE SELECTION TIMELINE

- February 4th MyEd Portal is open for you to enter your course requests
- February 28th MyEd Portal closes for course selection
 - After this date, all changes to your course requests must be completed by your counsellor
- April Course Verification begins (your chance to change your course requests)
- April Course Verification ends
 - After this date, you can still change your course requests through a conversation with your counsellor

5 Period Day

- Grade 11 & 12 Students will only take 8 courses inside the timetable
 - Semester 1 : Periods 1, 2, 3, 4, & 5
 - Semester 2: Periods 6, 7, 8, 9, & 10
- Students will likely have a spare with taking 4 classes in a 5-period day
- Students can take outside timetable courses like First Aid or Yearbook
- The outside of timetable courses count as one of their 8 courses total for the year

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GRADE 12 COURSES

Two Required Courses

- An English 12
- Career Life Connections 12
- Must have a minimum of four courses at the Grade 12 level to graduate (including English 12 but does not include CLC 12)

Seven Elective Courses*

- Any Grade 12 level course (aside from English 12) counts as an "elective"
- Off-timetable courses can count as one of your 8 courses

*Students may choose to add additional elective courses off-timetable



Each course is worth 4 credits and you need a minimum of 80 credits to graduate

Additional graduation requirements: an ADST or Fine Arts course (one in grade 10, 11, or 12), an Indigenous-focused course, minimum of 28 elective credits, minimum 30 hours of volunteer/work experience, Literacy 10 assessment, Numeracy 10 assessment, Literacy 12 assessment



LANGUAGE CHALLENGE EXAM

- If you fluently speak, read, and write Farsi, French, Japanese, Korean,
 Mandarin, Punjabi, or Spanish, you can write an exam to get Grade 11 or
 12 credit for one of these languages
- In October, get an application package from your counsellor when we announce they are available
- Submit it by the due date in November (along with the fee of \$50 for BC residents or \$205 for International students)
- Write the exam in January... get a passing grade and get credit!

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP)

AP Courses offer:

- access to rigorous college-level work
- exploration of subjects at a deeper level of learning
- development of confidence, time management and study skills
- advancement of research and communication skills
- increased creative, problem-solving, and analytical skills
- 4 credits per course towards graduation requirements
- possible credit for first-year university courses

Additional Language Requirements

- Some universities require specific language requirements
- For example
 - SFU
 - English Language Requirement: minimum of 3 years of study in English in Canada, or 6.5 IELTS/ 88 TOEFL
 - More information found at https://www.sfu.ca/students/admission/admission-requirements/english-language-requirement.html
 - UBC
 - English Language Admission Requirements: minimum of 4 years of study in English in Canada, or 6.5 IELTS/ 90TOEFL
 - More information found at https://you.ubc.ca/applying-ubc/requirements/english-language-competency/
- Testing
 - <u>IELTS</u>: International English Language Testing System required if schooling has not been in an English-speaking environment for the last 3 or 4 years
 - TOEFL: generally required if schooling has not been in an English-speaking environment for the last 3 or 4 years depending on institution



SUMMER SCHOOL

Summer school registration opens in April at

- Students going into grade 12 are welcome to register for any Grade 11 or 12 summer school class
- Grade 11 or 12 summer school classes provide advanced credit for the following school year students should request the next level of the course they plan to take in summer school (e.g., taking Pre-Calculus 12 in summer school, request Calculus 12 in your course requests if you want to advance your math skills)

APPLYING FOR POST-SECONDARY

- <u>Colleges</u> operate on a <u>first-come</u>, <u>first-served basis</u>. They will consider applications
 as they receive them and close applications when a program is full.
- Universities have specific deadlines for applications to be submitted. Applications are not considered until the deadline.
- Current application deadlines for 2025:
 - SFU Jan 31
 - UBC Jan 15
 - UVIC Jan 31
- Students can apply for most BC post-secondary schools using Education Planner at https://www.educationplannerbc.ca/

- Graduation from high school
- Minimum of 70% in Grade 11 or Grade 12 English (or their equivalents)
- At least six academic/non-academic Grade 12 courses (recommended, but not required)

Grade 12 requirements

- English Studies 12 or English First Peoples 12
- Pre-Calculus 12
- Anatomy and Physiology 12, or Chemistry 12, or Physics 12

Grade 11 requirements

For students starting September 2025:

- Any English Language Arts 11 or any English First Peoples 11
- A language 11 or waiver (includes all second language courses, including all Indigenous languages of Canada, but excludes introductory Grade 11 language courses)
- Chemistry 11
- Physics 11
- Pre-Calculus 11 or Foundations of Mathematics 12

For students starting September 2026:

- Chemistry 11
- Physics 11



SFU ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- An English 12 with a minimum final grade of 70%
- Foundations of Math 11 or Pre-calculus 11 with a minimum final grade of 60%
- Evaluation uses a minimum of <u>five Grade 12 courses</u> (including English 12) from the approved course lists
- The admission evaluation is based on all <u>Grade 11 and 12</u> courses taken from the approved course lists
- Approved course lists include <u>List A and List B courses</u>:
 - List A: <u>Highly valued courses</u> in the admission evaluation, as they are strong indicators of student success: courses are either required or recommended
 - List B: Valued courses in the admission process for their <u>breadth across disciplines</u>



UBC ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- An English 12 with a minimum final grade of 70%
- At least <u>six Grade 12 courses</u> (recommended)
- Overall academic assessment: UBC will broadly evaluate your academic history by looking at your grades in all Gr 11 & 12 classes
- Core academic assessment: The degree that you apply to will determine which courses UBC evaluates. UBC will look at your grades from all the academic Gr. 11 & 12 courses that fall under subject categories to the degree you applied to at UBC, with a stronger focus on Gr. 12 grades
- Assessment of individual courses: Must have strong grades in your key courses, e.g., English 12 (min 70%), Pre-Calculus 12....
- Recognition of breadth, rigor and relevancy in your course work not required for admission to UBC, but they may give your application an advantage

College Admission

- Admission & program requirements are not as rigorous as university requirements – earlier application is important!
- Most colleges have transfer programs to local universities
- Advantages of going to college
 - Closer
 - Less expensive
 - Smaller classes
 - Fewer admission requirements
 - Shorter certificate & diploma programs that lead to career options



BCIT ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS


- Program-specific requirements
- Ongoing applications
- You can apply once program requirements are met
- Programs may have more than one start date/year
- Often have extra assessment measures, e.g., English language assessment,
 Math competency test, Spatial perception test, Interview
- Sometimes have wait lists



Grade 12 Assembly


- Grade 12 student and parent presentations will happen in early October

 - Other important Grade 12 information














